<u>Awana Pledge</u>

The pledge to the Awana flag best describes the core purpose of Awana: "I pledge allegiance to the Awana flag, which stands for the Awana clubs, whose goal is to reach boys and girls with the gospel of Christ, and train them to serve Him."

Awana Core Principles

The Awana Ministry embraces six principles:

- 1. An Awana ministry is centered on the gospel.
- 2. It has high scriptural content.
- 3. It is fun and exciting for young people.
- 4. It is built on strong leadership.
- 5. It trains children and youth to serve.
- 6. It strengthens the church/parent partnership.

Awana Prayer

"Our prayer is that all children and youth throughout the world come to know, love, and serve the Lord Jesus Christ."

Know: our desire is that every child and youth will know Jesus personally and know that he/she has eternal life because he/she trusts in Jesus.

Love: the Lord desires intimacy with His children. We want to disciples children and youth to grow in their love towards God and others.

Serve: serving Christ is a supernatural by-product of loving Him. We want all believers to experience the joy of serving.

2 Timothy 3:17 "that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."

Ephesians 2:10 'For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

Policies, Procedures and Expectations

A Positive Attitude

An important factor in making this program a success is your attitude. It will make a profound difference to the kids and families we are serving.

Timeliness

You are exception to arrive each week by 5:10. Please be on time! We want you there to be able to welcome the and greet the kids. If for some reason you are unable to make it please let me know ASAP.

Phones

Please do not be on your phones during Awana. It is a distraction and takes away from the children. Keep your focus on the kids and not your phones. Please only use the phone in case of emergency or to take pictures.

<u>Participate</u>

Please participate! Do not just hang back and talk with the other leaders during game time, handbook time, the Bible lesson or the opening or closing ceremony. Be actively involved with the evening's activities.

Be Intentional and Build Relationships

Be intentional in your conversations with the kids. Get to know your kids and build relationships with them. This will give you a better opportunity to share the Gospel with the kids.

Drop-Off/ Pick-Up

Parent or guardian must come to the sanctuary to drop off their child(ren). Leaders should be at each end of the row in the sanctuary. The parents must come up to the leader to pick up their child(ren). DO NOT let a child go without seeing/talking to their parent. DO NOT leave before all of your children are picked up.

<u>Bathroom</u>

DO NOT go into the bathroom alone with a child. You are to escort your children to the restroom and wait outside the door. If they need help have someone else go in there with you.

<u>Allergies</u>

If a child in your class has an allergy we will let you know and put a sign up in your classroom so that you can be reminded.

Unruly Children

You'll need a blend of discipline, instruction and praise. If you are having problems with one of your children and you are having trouble resolving it yourself, please let me know

Emergency

If there is any kind of medical emergency please call 911 first and then let me know. If there is any kind of emergency please let me know so I can be aware of it. You can contact me on my cell phone at 210-900-5424.

Sharing the Gospel



Description of the Four Clubs CUBBIES

Cubbies is a two-year preschool program which celebrates the spiritual potential of preschoolers (3 to 5 year-olds) by helping them develop respect for God, His Son and His Word.



Apple Acres Entrance Booklet

Newcomers to Cubbies are taken through an introductory booklet that gives parents and children a brief overview of the program and presents God's plan of salvation at a preschooler's level. After completion of the sections, they receive a handbook and vest.

Handbooks

The Cubbies curriculum features two handbooks, AppleSeed and HoneyComb, which are written in a fun, storybook style with read-aloud stories and lovable characters that appeal to preschoolers. These handbooks combine basic Scripture memory with parent-child activities to help Cubbies grasp simple Biblical truths. Each Cubbies handbook contains a helpful review CD to use at home. Each week a section is assigned and clubbers work at the same pace through the same handbook. One handbook is completed in a club year.

Vest and Awards

Trail Emblems: Cubbies receive the AppleSeed Trail emblem for completing the sections.

Green and Red Apple Achievement Emblems: Cubbies earn four green apple emblems and four red apple emblems during the year.

SPARKS



Sparks is a three-year program for K, 1st, and 2nd graders. The Sparks curriculum consists of three handbooks. Each handbook communicates spiritual truths through verse memorization, review of key doctrine, and

Bible facts, building a foundation of wisdom for knowing Christ.

Flight 3:16 Entrance booklet

Sparkies new to the program always start with the Flight 3:16 booklet regardless of when they start. After completion, clubbers receive a red Sparks vest.

Handbooks and Awards

- 1. HangGlider-Kindergarten
- 2. WingRunner-1st Grade
- 3. SkyStormer- 2nd grade

Sparks Emblems

Sparkies earn a Sparks emblem by completing the first portion in their handbooks: HangGlider, WingRunner or SkyStormer.

Pilot Wings

Sparkies receive a pilot wing when they earn their first achievement jewel in a particular handbook. Pilot wings are green for HangGlider, blue for WingRunner and red for SkyStormer.

Jewels

There are 12 achievement jewels for each handbook with 4 of each color.

- Red- Awarded for completing Bible Drill sections.
- Green- Awarded for completing activity sections.
- Blue- awarded for club attendance, if Sparks have no more than one unexcused absence during the quarter.

TRUTH AND TRAINING (T&T)

T&T is a 3 year program for 3rd-5th graders.

Start Zone

T&T new to the program are to complete Start Zone before they begin their handbooks. After completion, clobbers will receive their T&T uniform.

Emblems

Clubbers will receive a Red, Yellow, Blue, or Green Emblem for the different sections they complete in their handbooks.

Extra Credit

Within each handbook section, there are "silver" and "gold" extra-credit activities for the clubbers who want to dig deeper into God's Word. The silver excesses provide additional Bible study exercises and the gold exercises typically provide four additional Bible verses for memorization. The silver and gold exercises can be completed in any order. A clubber will receive a silver emblem or gold emblem depending on the completion of all required sections.

Trek is a three program for 6th-8th graders.

Handbook

The trek kids will all work on the Bible Study "His Story" together. This Trek Bible Study helps middle school students understand God's story and answer the question, "Who are you?" Features clarified structure, consistent layouts, engaging lesson and daily devotional prompts. This study is easier to navigate, includes daily devotional and features one verse per week to allow for deeper group discussions.
